Schools Re-opening

I know that we all eagerly await some further government guidance on what will be happening with regards to schools opening and this week there has certainly been much speculation! I anticipate receiving further details from the Prime Minister on Sunday on details of how and when schools will fully reopen. It is worth noting that I, nor any other school have any prior notice of what will be said on Sunday and as such I politely ask that you give us time to respond to this potential announcement before contacting the school for further details.

It is worth noting that the Education Secretary, Gavin Williamson has said that the reopening of schools in England is expected to take place in a "phased manner". He told the Education Select Committee last week that the date for opening would depend on scientific advice - but schools would get "as much notice as possible". He added that the idea of all schools returning on day one with a full complement of pupils "would not be realistic".

I repeat my assurances to you that, once we know more we will be in touch with you all.

As you will know tomorrow is a bank holiday to mark the 75th anniversary of VE Day. It has been wonderful to see so many pictures of the children's work and learning around this area.
