Please find our suggestions for this week below. We have tried to plan the work to reflect what we would have been learning in school but, obviously, we have had to adapt. We have included planning from White Rose Maths and Hamilton Trust for English. They are fully resourced and can be either printed or discussed/completed orally. There are daily lessons for both maths and English. Please pick what works for your family and do not feel you have to complete everything. However, we ask that you try to read daily.

Maths:

White Rose Maths have provided home learning maths packs which include video tutorials and activities for the summer term. You can access them for free on a laptop or ipad.

(If the tasks in the Year 2 folder are too difficult, use Year 1 – the children are all at different stages in their learning and we would be differentiating tasks at school)

Each lesson begins with a 'Flashback' to recap some learning so far and there is a worksheet which could be printed, or discussed and completed orally. An answer sheet is also provided.

English:

Reading: Try to spend at least 10 minutes a day reading/sharing a book with your child. Don't forget 'Reading Eggs'

Remember: capital letters and full stops; try to include a question and some common exception words.


Rule: Rule: English words hardly ever end with the letter v, so if a word ends with a /v/ sound, the letter e usually needs to be added after the 'v'.
