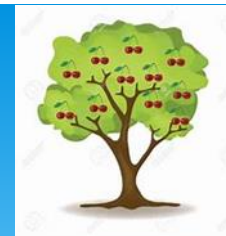

Sharing a story

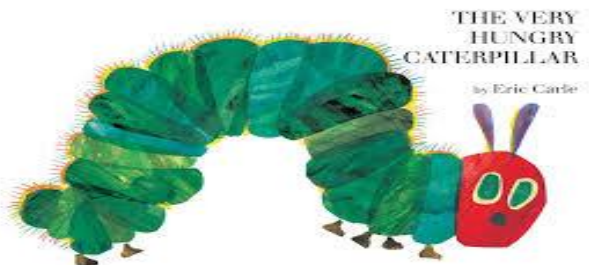
I am sure you have been reading and sharing lots of stories together so this week we thought you might like to try something different.

For the next 2 weeks we thought it would be nice to use the story of The Very Hungry Caterpillar to help inspire some activities for everyone as story itself covers so many different topics.

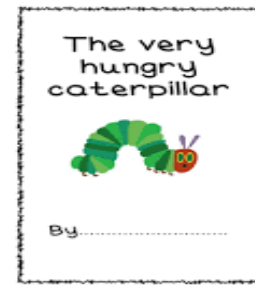
It would be lovely for you and the children to read the story. It is a story hopefully many of them will already be familiar with and hopefully the following activities will be fun and enjoyable for everyone.

The Very Hungry Caterpillar:

Days of the week

Can the children sort, organise and remember the days of the week? Can they find and sing a days of the week song, can they write the days of the week or have a go at the first letter and sound. Can they remember what the caterpillar ate on each day? Can they have a go at drawing or writing their own made up story using the days of the week.

Healthy foods

Can the children talk about foods they like?, foods that are healthy and unhealthy. Can they draw some foods for their caterpillar or character to eat? What would be their favourite foods and what would they like to eat? What would the rest of your families favourite foods be?

Make a caterpillar

What shapes can you see in a caterpillar? Can you find the right shape things to make a caterpillar? Why did everything have a hole in it? Can you have a go at making and threading things through a hole?
