<u>Literacy/Topic – Julia Donaldson Stories</u>

Last week we read the story of 'Room on the Broom'. This week we are going to look at the story of 'Monkey Puzzle' by Julia Donaldson (she even has her own website https://www.juliadonaldson.co.uk/)



In the story the little monkey gets lost. Have a look at his face throughout the story, how do think he is felling? Have you ever been lost? How did it make you feel? Talk with a grown up about what you should do if you ever get lost.

Can you draw map of the jungle and mark on the animals that are discovered in the story?




Choose one of the animals from the story. Then, can you make up some clues for a friend to help them identify the animal that you are thinking of.

Eg: What animal am I thinking about? It's brown, small and likes to hang upside down??

Could you make up another page for the book, in which the monkey gives a clue to the butterfly and the butterfly finds a different animal who might be the monkey's mum?

Have a think about the sounds that each animal makes... croak, squawk, hiss. Can you think of any others? Play a game with a grown up, make the noise and guess the animal

Phonics


Over the last few weeks we've been suggesting making phonics comics <u>https://phonicsplaycomics.co.uk/comics.html</u>
