The Year Two team

This week we will be covering the following:

Maths: Unit – Place Value (Year 2 up to 100 but differentiated for some children who may find this too difficult.)

After recapping some Year 1 skills last week, we are now beginning Year 2 place value work.

- Read and write numbers to at least 100 in numerals and in words.
- Recognise the place value of each digit in a twodigit number (tens, ones)

Identify, represent and estimate numbers using different representations including the number line

Science: Unit – Animals including humans The life cycle of a butterfly.

Having looked at life cycles of humans last week, we will learn about the lifecycle of a creature whose offspring do not look like the adults. **English: Week 2** of work based on a book by Oliver Jeffers called 'Here We Are: Notes For Living On Planet Earth'. The unit has been produced to help support all children returning to the school community, re-connect with each other and re-engage with school life. The words and pictures in the book work together to help children to understand their place in the world and to move forward together in a positive and constructive way post lock down.

Topic

History: Local area. To plan some some new amenities for Bagshot village. Draw a simple map to show the new features and construct a key.

Art: Artis study: Picasso- drawing in the style of this famous artist.

P.E.: Multi skills - Ball skills (hand-eye coordination)

P.S.H.E. - Week 2 Stories for well - being (Six week unit)

We will be using carefully chosen stories to develop the children's wellbeing alongside their literacy skills. Characters in the books are experiencing various issues: Transition; Happiness; Empathy; Worries; Resilience and Friendship. We will be using the books to stimulate discussion, and to allow the children to express their feelings.
