# Children in Reception learn through play, exploring, investigating, finding out, trial and error.

The Early Years curriculum has 3 Prime Areas and 4 Specific Areas:

#### Prime Areas:

Communication and Language
Physical development
Personal, Social and Emotional development


Specific Areas
Expressive Arts and Design
Mathematics
Literacy
Understanding the World



Children will also develop skills of perseverance, motivation, involvement, concentration, having a go, independence and problem solving. (thinking, trying, exploring)

We call these the Characteristics of Effective Learning (CoEL)and they underpin the Early Years Foundation Stage. (EYFS)

Later on we will be introducing these to the children in a friendly way represented by dinosaurs. We will send a letter to explain more at a later date.

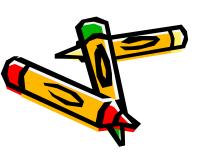




# In the moment planning

We assess and plan from the children's interests. This can often mean that children will be exploring different things from each class.

From October half term we will begin the first cycle of in the moment observations. Each child will be a focus child for a week; we will observe that child and move them on in their play, fulfilling the next steps there and then. We like you to be a part of this and you will be given a form to complete and return.




As well as independent, child-led learning, the children will take part in some adult-led learning.

# This will include reading (after half term):

- The children will then bring reading books home each week
- They will read individually, each week to an adult in school
- To start with, children will have un-worded books even if your child can read
- Children need to develop story telling and imagination in order to fully access the world of reading
- Please spend time looking at the pictures and asking your child to talk about what they see, what might be happening, what the characters are thinking or feeling as well as predicting what will happen on the next page.

The school expectation is that you read with your child at least 5 times a week!



#### Children will also learn phonics (sounds)

We follow the government scheme - Letters and Sounds.
We start with Phase 1 - which focuses purely on listening for sounds around us.

We will then move onto Phase 2 which focuses on single sounds such as: s a t p n

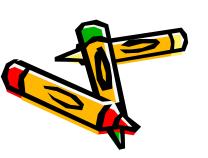


## Home Learning
